- **3. Slide Three:** Choose one artist who is part of the art movement and give a brief overview of their life and work. (10 points)
- 4. Slide Four: Describe and analyze one of the works by the artist you chose in section 3. List the title (The title of artwork should always be italicized), date and medium of the work.
- A. **Description:** What do you see in this work? What is the artist depicting in this work? Describe everything you see in the work.
- B. **Analysis**: How has the artist used the elements and principles of design: line, color, shape, texture, pattern, movement, rhythm? What is the focal point of the work? How has the artist used contrast? How are the different parts of the image unified together?
- C. **Interpretation:** Based on the clues that you collected in your description, what do you think this work is about? Explain what ideas, moods, emotions, stories you think the artwork communicates.
